- Illustrated Lives of the Saints, by John McNeill
This book gives short descriptions of 100 saints. The illustrations are in many ways the most important element of the book because they say something about how these saints came to be perceived, and the miracles they worked.
- Francis: A Saint's Way, by James Cowan
Aware that millions of people have admired, wondered at, and loved St. Francis, this author has sought to understand the man, to reach into his mind, and to see the world through his eyes.
St. Francis of Assisi: The Best from All His Works, edited by Stephen Rost
This collection of writings of Saint Francis clearly show the deep devotion he had to his God, his church, and all living creatures.
- Saint Patrick, edited by Iain MacDonald
This little book gives samples of the writings of St. Patrick. They give evidence in very different ways of the strong and inspirational personality that Patrick must have been for his contemporaries.
- Therese: The Saint Who Loved Us, by Arthur Cavanaugh
This book tells of Therese's childhood, her decision to enter Carmel and her growth into holiness.
Saint Therese and the Roses, by Helen Walker Homan
This book is written for children and is filled with action and good reading entertainment, and instruction & inspiration.
- In The Image of Saint Dominic: Nine Portraits of Dominican Life, by Guy Bedouelle, O.P.
A beautiful book of meditations on Various Christian virtues or charisms as reflected in the lives of nine holy Dominican men and women.
- Dictionary of Saints, by John J. Delaney
This new edition brings to life the inspiring accomplishments of over 5000 men and women of God.
- St. Frances Cabrini, A Saint For America, by Sergius C. Lorit
A biography of an Italian-born woman who recognized the dire needs of the American immigrants of the 19/20th century.
